#### VISITS TO THE LIBRARY


Taking young children to the library on a regular basis is very important, because eventually this will lead to more reading. Reading is one of the best activities to provide the foundational language and, literacy skills your child needs to succeed.

- When you take your children to the library you expose them to a great variety of books, and magazines
- Arrange your visits around story time when a librarian reads favorite children's books aloud.
- Introduce your children to the librarian, they can help your children to select books.
- Teach your child how to care for books. Children should learn at an early age how to handle library property; no holding books with dirty hands, bending the cover or pages, scribbling, or tearing. Young readers need to understand the importance of protecting books, so that everyone who uses the public library can enjoy them, again and again!
